All classes listed on page 2 are USEF/USDF/NCDCTA recognized. To enter these classes rider/owner/trainer must all be members of USEF or buy a show-pass (non-member) fee for each. Rider must be USDF Participating or Group member or pay a non-member fee. All horses must have at least a USDF HID# to enter. Owners of horses competing in this competition (non-qualifying rides), may have a USDF Participating, Group, or Business Membership or pay the USDF non-member fee. In regards to the (GAIG-Q)Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championship qualifying classes, horses must be USDF lifetime registered and USEF annual or lifetime recorded, riders are required to have an active USEF membership & USDF Participating Memberships. If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF. Riders/owners/trainers/coaches must all be current with the USEF Safe Sport training. All persons signing as Trainer must have USEF Senior membership. This includes parents signing as Trainer. The Trainer is the person legally responsible for the horse on the showgrounds. A minor cannot sign as the Trainer. All horses must be chipped and paperwork on file with USEF. USEF will require the microchip to be reported prior to the horse competition and will be associated with horse and competition records."

Pro-Am Team Challenge

Guest horses are welcome but must send in a completed entry form with guest horse fee plus the \$40 office fee, submit a current coggins, and stabling. GUEST HORSES MUST BE STABLED ON THE GROUNDS. Guest horses are not allowed on the warm-up pad during show hours.

STABLING

300 permanent stalls ranging from 10 x 10 to 12 x 12 with doors center-aisled barns. Initial bedding only. Extra bedding must be ordered with the entry in advance at \$10 per bag. NO BEDDING WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE SHOWGROUNDS. Many independent barns surround the show arenas. It has been strongly requested that overnight barn check be provided. We have increased the cost of a horse stall by \$10 to fund the added cost of this service. We have not increased the cost of a tack stall and are continuing to include 2 bags initial shavings with every stall including tack stalls.

Sharps containers are located at entrance end of each barn.

ARENAS

Three 20m x 60m on screenings with warm-up on screenings. Extensive open grass area for more independent warm-up. No one on foot is permitted in the warm-up arenas—all coaching must be done from the side.. Lunging on grass and on sand/clay track.

ENTRIES

EACH ENTRY MUST HAVE COPIES OF ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION ATTACHED OR ON FILE WITH SHOW SECRETARY. Upon receipt coggins & waivers will remain on file in show office for the Viewpoint show season.

Confirmations will be e-mailed upon receipt of entry.

Riders assume responsibility for verifying correct entry information. Management not responsible for errors.

Management requests that all entries be created on Fox Village. They charge a 5% user fee. If a snail mail entry is preferred the entry may be mailed along with check or credit card info (a 5% user fee is charged). Just a reminder: Online entries are immediate whereas snail mail may take forever or never. Online entries at https://entry.foxvillage.com/

Full refund if scratch is received by closing date less office fee. No refunds after closing date or after start of competition. This includes classes cancelled due to severe weather or other emergency conditions.

All entries received after the closing date will incur a \$50 late fee if accepted.

All entries are taken on a first come, first served basis. Late entries will be put on a wait list on an as-received basis. Management reserves the right to add, combine or divide classes, add/substitute judges, or make any changes required by circumstances.

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Post entries will be charged a late fee and will be placed on a waiting list to fill scratches. All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office prior to first ride will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled.

Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. These documents need to remain with the horse. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Check show website for changes in this policy which may go into effect at a later date by USEF.

Attention Competitors: Each competitor is responsible for supplying the show management with the correct and required association numbers of USDF and/or USEF for the horse, owner, rider, coaches, and trainer, and all documentation, including coggins & waivers no later than one week before the day (s) of the competition. Riders will not be allowed to compete if the USEF waivers have not been signed and submitted to management no later than one week prior to the start of competition. Riders & owners are eligible for one Show Pass (non-member fee) per competition year. Trainers &

Riders & owners are eligible for one Show Pass (non-member fee) per competition year. Trainers & coaches must be an Active USEF member and are not eligible for a Show Pass. Show management can no longer accept payment from an exhibitor for a Show Pass fee. Show Pass purchases can only be made directly online to the USEF offices at least one week prior to the start of the competition. A Show Pass is valid for one competition and is limited to no more than one Show Pass per individual per competition year.

All add/changes MUST be done by 5PM on the prior day. Absolutely no scratches will be filled during the competition day.

Only one horse/rider combination per entry form per show. This includes guest horse entries.

TIMES

Official times available Thursday at the secretary's stand. Times and stabling will be posted on our website one week prior to the show. www.carolinadressage.com. Final times to include any revisions will be posted and available by noon each day before the start of competition

Pony Division

If ponies are in need of a USEF measurement card, an appointment for measuring MUST be made with show management prior to the show. Owners of ponies needing measurement will be charged a fee not to exceed \$100 to cover the fee charged by the official veterinarian required for the measurement

DIRECTIONS

Pinehurst Harness Track, 200 Beulah Hill Road, Pinehurst, NC 28374. Located on N.C. 5 in Pinehurst, N.C. From North: US 1 or US 15/501, exit at Morganton Road in Southern Pines, turn west (right) to-ward Pinehurst. Follow Morganton to end, turn South (left) on NC 5. Use main Harness Track entrance on left.

From the West, take US 220 (I 73/74 corridor) to NC 211 east towards Pinehurst. Turn right at NC 5, Harness Track is 1.7 miles on left.

From South: US 1 to Aberdeen, turn left (West) on NC 5 to Harness Track, approx. 6 miles on right. Alternate route from US #1 North or South: turn at 15/501 North in Aberdeen and turn left at Morganton Road traffic light (Pinecrest Plaza shopping center). Proceed until Morganton Rd ends and turn left on NC 5. Harness Track entrance is on the left.

Turn right after entering facility and go past the Fair Barn and turn left on dirt road just past the parking lots. Show office is in Barn 14 on the far side of the track.

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HOSPITALITY

Food available on the grounds during the day. Free bottled water available all the time. .

CAMPING

Limited independent camping is available for \$40 per night—water & electric only

OTHER

All dogs must be leashed and attached to a person or immovable object.

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Rules and Regulations

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine classes; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio

-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

Coaches are not allowed within the warm-up arena and must remain outside the arena at all times.

Protective Headgear. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhi-bition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear pro-tective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place.

Important notice to all affected parties:

No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced, or remove them from the show grounds without permission of the show secretary (GR 805).

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Viewpoint Swat 'n Sweat series: consists of all 6 Viewpoint shows at the Pinehurst Harness track: Dressage in the Sandhills May 9-11, MayDay May 24 & 25, Summertime Blues June 7 & 8, Rise 'n Shine July 12 & 13; Early Morning Blues August 2 & 3; CoolDown August 30 & 31. Riders must have competed 4 of the 6 shows to be eligible. Each rider's top 4 scores will be averaged to determine the series champion at each level.

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ENTRY DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS

Include with entry documentation copies of:

- Current USEF membership (or Show Pass) Rider, Owner and Trainer (coach, if applicable)
- ◆ Current USDF membership (or n/m #) Rider and Owner. . Rider's USDF membership may be either Participating or GMO, Owner's USDF membership may be Participating, GMO or Business; if Rider/Owner's USDF # is a N/M ID #, the USDF nonmember fee must be paid.
- USDF & USEF Horse ID (minimum requirement to compete
- Current (1 Yr) negative coggins
- ◆ Copy of Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumontis) vaccinations dated within 6 months of show.
- For Amateur classes USEF membership card must declare Amateur
- Juniors and Young Riders must include birthdate.
- Freestyle entries must qualify at the highest test of that level from a USEF recognized show
- ◆ ENTRIES MUST BE COMPLETE AT LEAST ONE WEEK PRIOR TO THE START OF COMPETITION BEFORE THE HORSE WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE SHOWGROUNDS.
- Parents signing as trainer of minor must be Active Competing Senior members (\$80) of the USEF.
- ♦ Horses must have an equine microchip registered with USEF at least 1 week prior to show.

For Great American/USDF Qualifying Classes also include:

- State "Qualifying" and include \$15 per Qualifying class
- Copies of USEF and USDF Horse Registrations (not HID #s) document must list owner
- Owners and riders are required to have an active USEF membership, riders must have a USDF Participating Membership. If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

There is no extra qualifying fee for the BLM qualifiers. Riders must declare their intent to compete in the BLM Championships. Contact http://www.cblm.org/

Opportunity Classes Requirements

No memberships or horse registrations are required however classes will be conducted under USEF rules.

All entries must have 3 signatures - Rider, Owner and Trainer.

Legal Guardian must sign for riders under 18 yrs. Trainer blank must be signed by person over 18 who assumes responsibility for horse. If a coach is listed on the entry form they, must sign the signature space on the back.

If you are a USEF competing member 18 years of age or older you are required to take the core Safe Sport training within 30 days of activating your membership. Take the Safe Sport Training at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard."

PLEASE NOTE

There are a VERY limited number of available paddocks & RV spots.

There are only a handful of spots that offer stall/paddock/RV capability.

In addition there are few more RV/stall availability spots.

Then there are a few more paddock only spots within walking distance of the barns.

We suggest reserving these spots well in advance of any of the 6 shows Viewpoint offers.

Entries and \$\$ are not necessary to reserve spots.

We may not be able to keep groups together if one or more reserve spots.

It may be a good alternative to consider sharing paddocks within groups.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

Under North Carolina law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury or to the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. Chapter 99e of the North Carolina General Statues.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan*/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan*/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan*/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
